I am pleased to say that our new Strategic Business Plan has come together nicely. Since the Spring Annual General Meeting, many hours of meetings and discussions have taken place. The seven different committees have done a great job in getting this year off to a great start. These committees are: Governance, Curling, Operations and Resources, Finance, Marketing, Human Resources and Communications, and Social. Thanks to all the members on these committees for their great work.

As of last week, our membership has reached a total of 643. This is 14 more than last year. I want to welcome everyone back and extend a special welcome to our new members.

The Royal Kingston Curling Club has new rules with regard to outside charities and soliciting. Only "grandfathered" charities will be allowed to continue without Board approval. The Board feels that our members should not be repeatedly approached for donations. The Club does not wish to have its supplies or services used for unrelated commercial activities or fundraising efforts that the Board of Directors has not specifically approved. The following charities are "grandfathered": Cancer Society, Cancer Relay for Life, Food Bank, Alzheimer's Coffee Breaks, Alzheimer's Walk For Memories, Alzheimer's, Diabetes Association and Shoe Boxes.

The Club is once again recycling, so please use the recycling containers that have been placed around the club.

With the H1N1 Virus going around, we ask that all our members be proactive in helping to stop the spread of this virus. Hand sanitizers have been placed in the ice shed as well as at the front door and bar. Some members have chosen not to shake hands after the game—this is fine, so please don't

Committee Reports

Financial Committee

This past summer the Financial Committee met twice, on June 15, 2009 and on September 23, 2009. We have been busy preparing our mandate, roles and responsibilities of the Committee and the Chair, and the committee's work plan, as per the RKCC Business Plan objectives. I expect the finished drafts of these documents will be approved for distribution by the Board at the November Board meeting.

The 2009/2010 RKCC Budget was finalized and approved at the August 20th Board meeting. It forecasts a small surplus at year-end of ~\$4K, depending on what the economy does for the remainder of the season, of course, and barring other unforeseen expenses.

As outlined at the Spring AGM, the Financial Committee has used software developed by the Federal Government for Capital Replacement planning and the resulting annual provision calculated by this software has been incorporated into this year's budget. This will be an on-going component of our budget from now on, and this should ensure we are prepared for any eventuality.

The Capital Replacement Fund will grow by the amount of the annual provision in every succeeding year.

Finally, a key objective of the RKCC Business Plan is to develop and maintain year-round operations. This past summer was the first year that the Club was open for normal business activity with a full-time manager. Many of our expenses are ones that would be incurred regardless if we were open or shut, but overall the comparison between this year (2009 – 100%) and last year (2008 – 50%) show a potential to grow our 'business' further. Off-season expenses grew by ~\$10K, which is understandable, given full-time wages and increased utility costs with being open. Off-season revenues grew by ~8.5K. The Club is very close to breaking even with full-time operation. The revenue increase offset most of the expense increase, and we believe the potential to further strengthen the revenues is very high. The Financial Committee recommends that the Club continue with full-time operation in 2010.

Marketing Committee

As Chairman of your 2009-10 Sponsorship / Advertising Committee I want to take this opportunity to thank my Committee for their hard work: Garry Dupuis, Roger Taylor, Deanne Clark, Brad Finch, and Graham Weatherby.

As of this writing, we have lost only 3 Wall Advertisers and one In-ice Advertiser. However, we have been able to add seven new Wall Advertisers so our totals now sit at four In-ice Advertisers and 51 Wall Advertisers. All but two of the Advertisers have paid their fees, and the others are expected shortly.

I'd like to take this opportunity to thank Gord Gillespie and SLH Transport for their In-ice Sponsorship support since the new Club opened, and let him know that we are sorry to see them remove their sign this year. They will be missed.

In September, the City held its annual Leisure Showcase. This year it was held at the new Invista Centre and our RKCC booth was organized and manned by several volunteers, headed up by Pam & Roger Taylor. I want to thank them, and all the volunteers for their efforts.

Based on our experience from the Leisure Showcase, our Committee is working on getting some new banners and brochures made up to enhance our ability to show off RKCC at these trade show-style events.

From Feb.1 – 7th, 2010 the Ontario Men's Curling

Tankard is being held in Napanee. As part of the program activities, the Napanee Club will be showcasing various curling clubs from our region and on Monday, Feb. 1st they will be recognizing RKCC. Our President and Club Manager will introduced during pre-draw ceremonies, and we will also have a Booth for the day and we will have a ½ page ad in the event Newsletter. We are looking for volunteers to help prepare for this event and if you would like to help, please let myself, or any member of the Sponsorship Committee know.

We would like to bring to your attention that we still have about 6 curling rocks that can be sponsored for \$500 each. Please contact myself or Graham if you would like to purchase the naming rights to a rock. This is a great way to honour a past curler or contributor to RKCC.

The shooter should always be in the hack ready to shoot when the skip calls the shot. The skip should not ever be waiting for the shooter.

Whatever lead is shooting the first rock in the next end should get ready in the hack. Let the other 5 players clear the rocks.

All curlers should be ready to play at least 10 minutes prior to the scheduled start time. Shake hands while the ice is being cleaned, rather than waiting.

Thanks to all who have helped so far in setting up the schedules, teams etc and a special thanks to all members of the curling committee for the effort to make as much ice time available for all members.

Our Christmas party will be held this year on Monday Dec 21. This is a change from the calendar as we had to juggle the schedule to find the extra 4 nights curling that was required for flight this year. 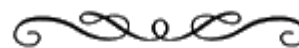

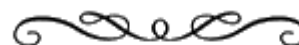
