A word from your President...

It always surprises me how quickly the curling season comes to an end. To all those participating in Championship night on April 17; congratulations, good luck and good curling! And most importantly, enjoy the moment!

Our Annual General Meeting takes place starting at 1 pm on Sunday, April 19 followed by "Skate out the Ice". I hope you are able to attend to hear the board and committee reports on the 2014-2015 season.

We recently held the last board meeting for the current board (prior to the new board being appointed at the AGM) and the major topic for the meeting was the setting of the budget for next season. RKCC's annual revenue is in excess of \$600,000. Surprisingly, less than 40% of our revenue comes from membership fees. The balance (over 60%) comes from four sources:

- bar and food operations including lounge rentals (33%)
- bonspiels and curling rentals (17%)
- Pro shop sales (7%)
- Advertising (6%)

So as we attempted to balance our budget for the upcoming season we concluded that we should equitably distribute rate increases across all revenue sources rather than focus primarily on membership fees. Thus, while we expect membership fees to go up by approximately 5% next year, this would have had to have been considerably higher if we hadn't "shared the load" across all revenue sources.

As this is the last issue of Sweep for this season, I'd like to take this opportunity to wish everyone a wonderful summer!


Day Men's In-House Bonspiel

82nd Annual "The Whig" Men's Open Bonspiel

The 82nd annual Whig Standard Men's Bonspiel was held Jan. 29 to 31^{st.} with play at both the Royal Kingston Curling Club and the Cataraqui Golf and Country Club. The bonspiel started earlier on Thursday afternoon to ensure more games at the host club and avoid teams having to play 3 games on Friday and 3 games on Saturday.

This year, there were 54 teams competing for \$6,000 in prizes. In the main event final Jonathan Beuk and his team from Cataraqui won their second title in 3 years defeating Ed Warren from Carleton Heights Curling Club.
